Rules for the Ambassador of the Fair Competition are as follows:

- Competitors must be between the ages of 17 and 23 years as of August 1, 2011
- Competitors must reside in the village of Milverton or in the former Townships of Mornington, Elma, North Easthope or Ellice, or have been a Milverton Fair exhibitor in the previous two years.
- Each competitor is to create a Display Board (4ft x 3 ft) about themselves to be viewed by all
- Each competitor will be interviewed by a panel of judges on the day of the competition (approx. 10 minutes).
- Each competitor must prepare a short speech (3 to 5 minutes) on a topic of his or her choice related to Agriculture, the Environment or Agricultural Fairs.
- Each competitor will be expected to give a brief oral answer in the impromptu segment.
- The competition will be limited to 5 contestants and the judges' decision is final.

For the winner to receive the \$250 Bursary they will be expected to:

- Attend the remainder of the 2011 Milverton Fair and assist where required
- Ride in the Santa Clause Parade (Dec 2011) & Attend our Earth Day Event in 2011
- Represent Milverton Fair at the Ambassador Program held at the Annual Convention for Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies at the Royal York Hotel in Toronto Feb 2012

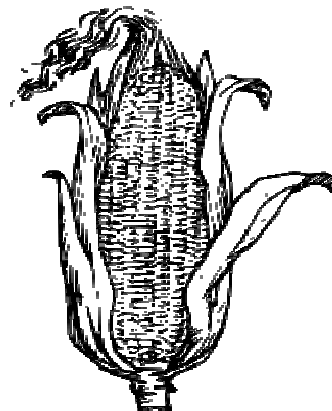

All plants entered should be in good condition with damaged or old leaves and old blooms removed. Flowering plants should be in bloom for judging. All plants and flowers should be grown by and belong to exhibitor. An exhibitor may enter only ONE entry in each section of each class. Buds showing colour are considered blooms. Open bottom pots must be contained. Potted plants must be grown in pots NOT dug from the garden.

Definitions:

Spray = a portion of a plant with a number of flowers, eg.

Chrysanthemum or Petunia

Stem = a single stem carrying one or more flowers and/or buds and greenery, eg. Snapdragon

Centerpiece = a design to be seen from all sides.

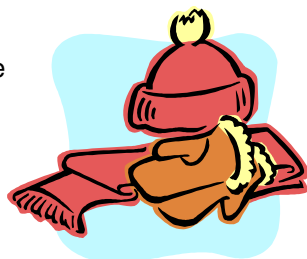

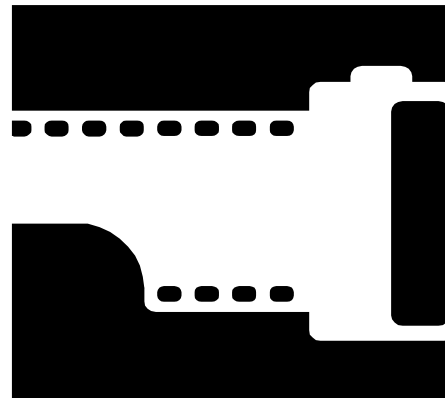
